## Scrapies Tag Rules Changed for 2010

Effective with the 2010 tag-in, the Livestock Task Force is requiring all sheep and goats to have a scrapies tag or tattoo accompanied by the tattoo registration papers before they enter the grounds. No exceptions to this rule. This means no matter what the age of the sheep or goat. ALL sheep and goats must have this scrapies tag or tattoo accompanied by the tattoo registration papers or they will not be allowed to enter the fairgrounds, show, exhibitor or sell. This rule was passed Feb. 2, 2010 by the board of directors of the Athens Co. Agricultural Society.

## Livestock Tag-In and Animal Registration

## **Junior Fair Feeder Calf Exhibitors Have Option To Sell Their Calves at the Athens County Fair Again in 2010**

The Beef Feeder Calf Sale will take place at the 2010 Athens County Fair on Saturday, August 14 at 10:00 am. This sale is for junior fair beef feeder calf exhibitors who wish to sell their calf. The Beef Committee introduced this pilot sale in 2009. The following rules apply to this sale to please read them closely:

- Calves are only for junior fair exhibitors, no open class calves will be sold
- Calves must be tagged in as Junior Fair projects on May 12, 2010. There is a \$2 per calf registration fee
- They must be brought into the fair grounds to be tagged
- Exhibitors must designate which calf they will sell by Thursday, August 12 9:00 am.
- Calves will sell by the head.
- Heifers and steers will sell together in the Saturday sale.
- \$20 per head commission flat fee
- Calves must weigh between 400 and 700 lbs. Under 400 or over 700 will not sell
- Exhibitor can only sell one feeder calf through the sale ring in Saturday's sale.
- All feeder calves going through the ring on Saturday, August 14, 2010 must be removed from the fairgrounds by 3:00 pm that day.

## Stall Drawing

Stall drawing forms must be turned in no later than Monday, July 19, 2010. Stall drawing will be held on Thursday, July 22, 2010 in the Junior Fair Building on the fair grounds at 7:00 pm. Forms have changed. Each club must list the exhibitor's name and the number of each species they are bringing and the number of stalls needed along with ear tag numbers. Barn superintendents will make stall assignments prior to the fair. These sheets are then going to be crosschecked with sale committee sheets and the club enrollment sheets in order to avoid drawing for extra stalls. Clubs should mail the stall request form so that it is postmarked no later than Monday, July 19, 2010. Clubs failing to turn in a stall request form will take what is left over in all barns after the drawing is finished. Forms can be mailed to: Stall Drawing, Athens Co. Jr. Fair, P.O. ## King/Queen Applications

Please make sure that you give each candidate a copy of the rules. Completed applications and a photograph must be returned to the Junior Fair Board no later than Monday, July 19, 2010. These should be mailed to: King/Queen Applications, Athens County Jr. Fair, and P.O. Box 669, Athens OH 45701 or dropped off at the Extension Office to Matt Davis. All applications must be in an envelope. All applications must be completed in full to qualify. If an application is incomplete you will not qualify as a candidate. All photographs must be originals, no photocopies will be accepted. **Do not glue your photo to the application.** These photos will become the property of the fair and will not be returned to you. Judging will take place in the Secretary's Office on Sunday, July 25, 2010 at 2:00 p.m. There will be no other judging times. You must attend if you are to be considered a candidate. Light refreshments will be served during the judging as this may take several hours.

## **New USDA Rule For Swine Identification To Take Place Again In 2010**

The USDA is requiring all Ohio Fairs to tattoo market swine before they leave the fairgrounds the week of the fair. This tattoo will be placed on all market swine during the week of the fair prior to the Friday night junior fair livestock sale. Please be prepared when the sale committee comes around to tattoo your animal. Questions can be directed to any Livestock Task Force member.

## Parade Reservation Forms

Parade reservation forms are due no later than Monday, July 19, 2010. These can be turned in to the Secretary's Office to be placed in Paula Carpenter's mailbox. There is only one form this year. Reservation and narration must be turned in all at once. **DO NOT E-MAIL THESE FORMS NO RESERVATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE DEADLINE! NO EXCEPTIONS.**

## **Notice to all exhibitors of ruminant animals**

The Ohio Department of Agriculture requires all exhibitors of ruminant animals (cattle, sheep, and goats) to sign a form stating that they have not been fed any animal by-products. This form must be turned in at the gate when you arrive with your ruminant animals for check-in on Saturday, August 7, 2010. More information on when and where this will be distributed will follow at a later date.

## **Quality Assurance Sessions For 2010**

**#1-Thursday May 13, 2010 at 6:30 p.m.** in the Grange Building located on the fairgrounds. Signup will begin around 5:30 pm. **#2-Monday, May 17, 2010 at 3:00 p.m. at Alexander H.S. Vo-Ag room, #3-Saturday June 12, 2010 at 9:00 a.m., signup will begin at 8:00 a.m. #4 Sunday, July 18, 2010 at 2:30 p.m. signup will begin at 1:30 p.m.** Quality assurance is mandatory for all junior fair exhibitors of rabbits, poultry, waterfowl, dairy cattle, beef cattle, dairy feeder calves, swine, sheep, and goats. Dog exhibitors no longer have to take a QA. Horse exhibitors who are only taking a horse may take the equine QA with Matt Davis. If an equine exhibitor is taking another animal, they must attend one of the regular QA sessions as well. Any exhibitor failing to attend one quality assurance session will be ineligible to show and/or sell their animal at the 2010 Athens County Fair. The sessions will begin promptly at the time listed. Will not allow you to enter the session after the session begins. Athens H.S. will also offer a session. Contact Sabrina Stalder for this date and time.

### Drug Use Notification Forms

Drug Use Notification Forms are required for all livestock entering the Athens County Fairgrounds except dogs and rabbits. These forms are mandatory for open class livestock as well as junior fair livestock. The Ohio Department of Agriculture requires us to send in drug use notification forms on all beef cattle, dairy cattle, goats, sheep, swine, horses, dairy beef feeders, and poultry.

**Ducks and geese are considered market poultry so they will also be required to fill out the drug use forms.** You will need one form per animal except market chickens; they can fill out one form per pen of chickens. Exhibitors attempting to enter without the DUNF or have incomplete forms will be turned away as ODA rules apply. More information on when and where these will be distributed will follow at a later date.

ALL Junior Fair Market dairy feeder calves must be slick sheared to ¼ inch. Slick Shearing means removing all flexible hair from the animal. ## NEW 2010 GUIDELINES

**Ultimate Showmanship  
Friday, August 13, 2010 9:00 A.M.  
Swine Show Arena**

Committee: Sabrina Stalder, Chair; Paula Carpenter, Records Official, Jim Washburn, Tom Weekley, Larry "Buggs" Stalder, Rick Six, Scott Simons, Bruce Lackey, John Williams,

### GUIDELINES:

1. Participants must be Junior Fair age.
2. The contest will be divided into 12 parts (Western Horse, English Horse, Sheep, Market Goats, Dairy Goats, Swine, Beef, Dairy, Dairy Feeder Calves, Poultry, Rabbits, and Dogs)
3. Participants will be the winners of Pro-Showmanship for each of the 12 parts.
4. Winners do not have to participate if they do not wish to.
5. Participants will show in 11 different species using correct showmanship techniques for each species. Participants will not show their own species.
6. The Pro-Showmanship winner for each species will demonstrate the showmanship technique before each part.
7. The judge will rate the participants on a scale of one to ten with one being the best and ten being the worst. Participant with the fewest total points in the ten departments will be the winner.
8. In the case of a tie, tying participants will draw two animals from one department and show these two animals to break the tie. Tie breaking animals cannot be from the same department as the member's project.
9. Ultimate Showmanship winners may not compete again in the same species in which they participated in previous years, but may participate in another species if they are taking that species as a project. Example: Johnny wins swine pro-showmanship and signs up to participate in the Ultimate Showmanship contest and wins. He cannot come back next year in swine; he can only participate in another species. This species must be a project exhibited and shown at the fair that year.
10. Contestants are not allowed to speak to each other while in the show ring. Contestants talking to each other while in the show ring will be disqualified from that species.
11. Participants must sign up to participate in the Ultimate Showmanship contest and present a waiver of liability signed by themselves and a parent or guardian no later than the end of the specie show in which they win Pro-Showmanship.
12. In the event the pro-showmanship winner is ineligible to show in the Ultimate Showmanship contest, the 2<sup>nd</sup> place winner will be offered the chance to show.
13. Exhibitors allowing the Ultimate Showmanship contest to use their animal for the event must present a signed waiver of liability with their signature and the signature of a parent or guardian.
14. Judge must be from outside Athens County and cannot be listed as an advisor in any Athens County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter.

**\*\*NOTE: Winners must notify the committee that they plan to participate no later than Wednesday, Aug. 11 at 9:00 pm. If you do not notify us we will assume you are not participating and will move to the 2<sup>nd</sup> place winner.\*\***

### Athens County Junior Fair Picket Fence Decorating Contest

Fences are to be turned in to the Junior Fair Board Office on Saturday, July 24, 2010 by 2:00 PM

**RULES:**

1. Open to all Junior Fair groups.
2. Fences will be judged with regards to the Junior Fair Theme.
3. Must be in good taste.
4. No advertising, political figures or religious.
5. You may use an already made fence section, or you can make your own picket fence.
6. Must be made of materials that will stand up to the elements outside.
7. After the judging, you may choose to put your fence in front of your booth in the Junior Fair Building. If you choose not to use your fence in your booth, then it will be displayed on the fairgrounds.
8. Not to exceed 4 ft. wide by 4 ft. tall
9. No electrical parts.
10. Any entry deemed to be offensive would be disqualified.
11. Winners will receive a ribbon for 1<sup>st</sup> thru 5<sup>th</sup> place.
12. Entries must remain on fairgrounds for the entire week of the fair
13. No entry fee required.

### Athens County Fair Chicken Pulling Contest

Chicken Pull begins Thursday, August 12 at 5:00 p.m.  
Object: Place a chicken harnessed to a sled inside a circle and measure the time that it takes for the chicken (without being touched) and the sled to exit the circle.

**RULES:**

1. No touching the chicken or any part of the sled after they are placed into the circle.
2. No hitting or kicking the chicken-before, during or after the pull.
3. Do not throw the chicken into the circle, gently set the chicken down.
4. NO FOWL LANGUAGE!!
5. Only chickens are allowed, no waterfowl.
6. You have 20 seconds to get the bird out of the circle or you will receive "no time".
7. You can stomp your feet, talk to your chicken, blow on it, skake keys, wave at it.... anything but DO NOT TOUCH THE CHICKEN!!
8. Only chickens exhibited at the fair or chickens that have been Pullorum tested can participate.
9. Only one chicken is allowed in the show ring at a time.

- .50 chicken rental (Any chicken brought onto the fairgrounds must be have been tested for Pullorum)
